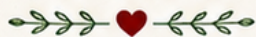

Cheryl's Tips

FOR MAKING

RESIN COASTERS

Beautiful. Durable. Handmade with Love.



1. MEASURE ACCURATELY

Always follow the resin manufacturer's mix ratio exactly (usually 1:1 by volume). Use measuring cups for best results.



2. MIX SLOWLY

Stir resin slowly for 3–5 minutes, scraping the sides and bottom of your cup. This helps prevent air bubbles.



3. WORK IN A WARM SPACE

Ideal room temperature is 70–75°F. Cold temperatures can cause resin to cure improperly.



4. PREP YOUR MOLD

Make sure your molds are clean, dry, and level. A level surface helps your coasters cure flat and smooth.



5. ADD INCLUSIONS CAREFULLY

Place dried flowers, herbs, or decorations **after** pouring a thin base layer of resin. This helps keep them in place.



6. REMOVE BUBBLES

Use a heat gun, torch, or straw to gently remove surface bubbles. Don't overheat!



7. LESS IS MORE WITH GLITTER

A little glitter goes a long way. Sprinkle lightly for a subtle sparkle without overpowering your design.



8. ALLOW FULL CURE TIME

Let your coasters cure 24–48 hours (or as directed by your resin kit) before removing from the mold.



9. SEAL & PROTECT (OPTIONAL)

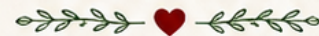
For extra shine and protection, you can add a final coat of resin after the first cure is complete.



10. CARE FOR YOUR COASTERS

Wipe clean with a soft, damp cloth. Avoid harsh chemicals and extreme heat to keep them beautiful.

CHERYL'S EXTRA TIPS



- ✓ Use high-quality resin for a crystal-clear finish.
- ✓ Store resin bottles tightly closed and in a cool, dark place.
- ✓ Wear gloves and work in a well-ventilated area.
- ✓ Get creative! Layer colors, textures, and botanicals to make each coaster unique.
